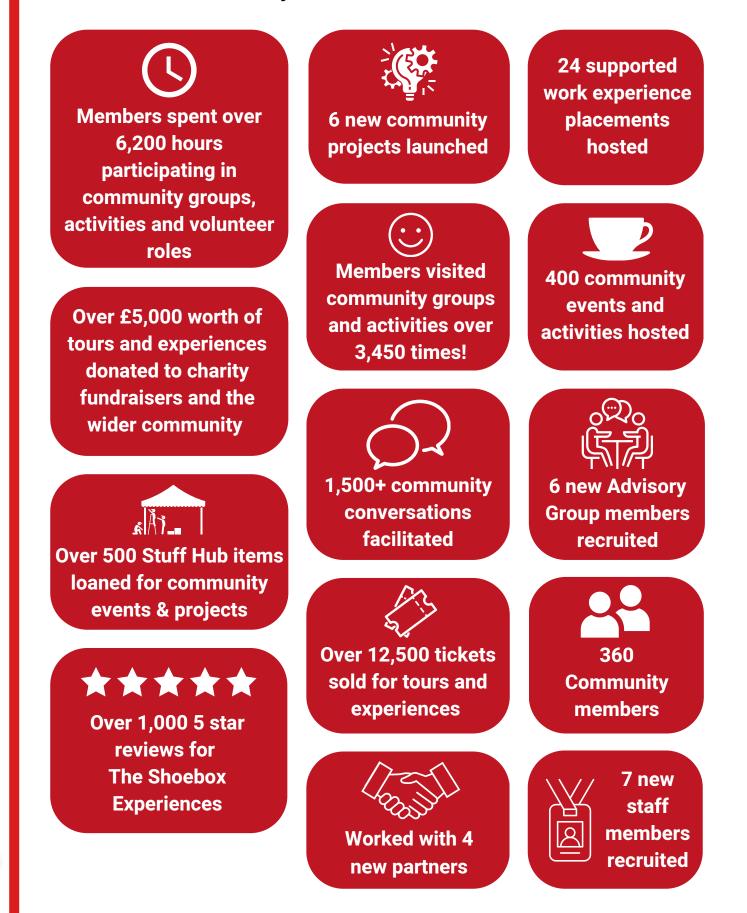

The Shoebox Community Norwich

The Shoebox on Castle Meadow, Norwich is our flagship community hub. In 2023, our community membership grew substantially. Members are finding us through a number of different ways such as word of mouth, social media and external referrals, highlighting the strong reputation we have established.

Our Shoebox code of conduct, which was developed with our community, sets out the expected behaviour of all members and ensures everyone contributes in helping to ensure The Shoebox offers a friendly, welcoming space for all.



We host and support a wide range of community groups and activities. We have something for everybody, from coffee mornings and a board game group to sessions to try out creative writing, baking and so much more!

Our community model relies on members sharing their time, skills and interests to support the running of community groups and activities. In 2024, we hope to secure funding to recruit a Community Kickstarter to work alongside community members and groups to strengthen our offering and to help build the capacity of our members to participate at a level that is right for them. We also want to explore how we can increase diversity and support more evening and weekend groups to reach more people.



In 2023, our hub celebrated it's second birthday with our fantastic community!

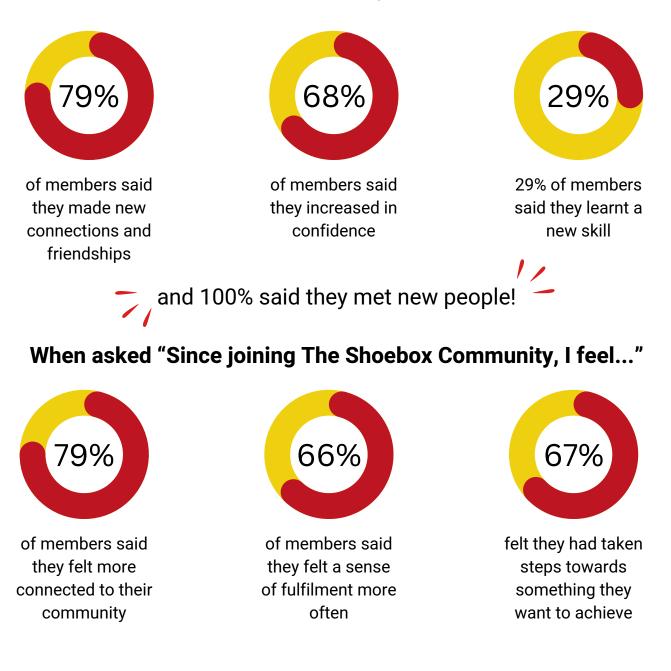




Member feedback

I also enjoyed the baking for wellbeing sessions and that has helped me tremendously. They're a lovely group and I love cooking and I love seeing how other people do their cooking.

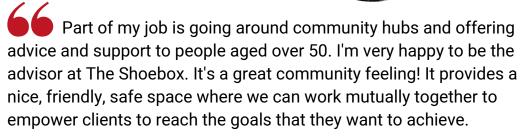

The future of The Shoebox, Castle Meadow

In October 2023 we had to share an important but very difficult update regarding the future of The Shoebox Community Hub and home of the famous 'hidden street'. Unfortunately, we received notice from our landlord to vacate our much loved flagship venue.

This came as a big shock to many as it's been the treasured heart of our Shoebox community for over two years. Originally the landlord wanted us to leave the venue by the end of the year but fortunately we managed to negotiate an extension, initially until the end of April 2024.



This news was unsettling for everybody but the extension granted us a little more time to make plans for the future of The Shoebox. We approached this situation with a positive outlook but were sad at the thought of leaving our home and mindful of the potential impact this uncertainty could have on our valued community members and customers, as well as our dedicated staff.



After sharing this news with our community members and customers, we were blown away by the outpouring of supportive messages, comments on social media and press coverage.

In early 2024, largely thanks to the overwhelming response from our community, customers and supporters, our landlord had a change of heart and our lease was extended for another three years!

The Shoebox Community Great Yarmouth

In March 2023 we were thrilled to receive funding from the Know Your Neighbourhood fund, which aims to increase regular volunteering and reduce chronic loneliness.

We initially delivered a one month pilot to explore opportunities to expand the Shoebox Community to Great Yarmouth. We received really positive feedback from Great Yarmouth and Gorleston communities and found that it was possible to grow a Shoebox community without a physical community hub, as we have in Norwich. We learnt lots from this initial pilot and this insight led to us receiving further funding to continue this work until at least 31st March 2025!



I live with my parents, and I don't go out much. It's good to come here and get out the house. It helps me be with other people and helps me to socialise more. Coming to these sorts of things gives people a purpose. It's like, 'I've achieved something today!'







Growing our Great Yarmouth Community

In October 2023, following being awarded further funding, we welcomed Hari to The Shoebox team as Community Kickstarter in Great Yarmouth. She is working closely with Hayley, a fellow Community Kickstarter from ProCommunity CIC to expand our community groups and activities and to find ways to reach more people who may be experiencing loneliness.

Our Great Yarmouth Community already has 40 registered members and had 88 visits to community groups!

Community Kickstarter

Baking for Wellbeing

The Baking for Wellbeing project provides a fun way for Shoebox members to meet new people while baking and cooking delicious treats!

Sessions are for all abilities from complete novices to the more experienced to bake together in a kind and inclusive environment.

Each session focuses on a single recipe which the group will make together with Mark and other volunteer helpers. At the end of the session, everyone takes their delicious baked treats home along with the recipe to recreate.

Maths in Baking

This year we launched Maths in Baking, part of the national Multiply Skills for Life campaign. Building on the learning from our popular Baking for Wellbeing project, we created three fun, friendly workshops to explore the maths skills used when baking to build participant's confidence in using day to day maths.



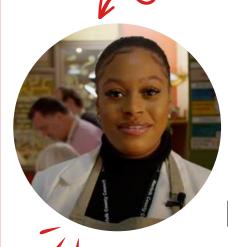
Over the three sessions, participants get to bake shortbread, rocky road and cheese straws. While baking, we collaboratively look at estimating, scaling, weighing and costings.

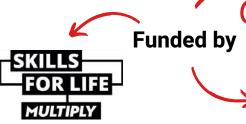

Next Steps

2023 saw the end of our supportive work experience project, Next Steps. Over the course of one year, we worked with 31 people, each for up to eight weeks, who were looking to grow new skills and confidence.

Over the course of the project, 25 participants **completed more than 20 hours of bespoke work experience** within our organisation, could **identify more personal strengths** at the end, shared they **felt more confident** and **moved on to further training, personal development or work**!

Community Connectors Project

Our team of Community Connectors have conversations with local residents in key neighbourhoods in Norwich to discover what matters to them, what they are passionate about and what they would like to do with others to help them flourish in community life!

Community Connectors have been recruited from their local neighbourhoods and are managed and supported by The Shoebox but work for the benefit of their local community. Norwich City Council works in partnership with The Shoebox to support the continued development of the Community Connector team and wider Community Conversations project. Additionally, they oversee the analysis of community conversations and sharing of insights through the Community Conversations Insights Hub.

Another conversation we had when door knocking highlighted issues with 18-29 year olds not working and the pressure it puts on parents finances.



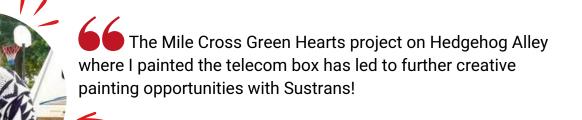




What is your Community Connector highlight from 2023?

Working with the Community Conversation Officers from Norwich City Council, we compiled a calendar of social activities that are held in the city centre. We then distributed this among the groups we attended and the residents we spoke to. Many didn't have internet access or weren't aware of where to look for these social events.

One person I spoke to said that she didn't see many people from day to day. I told her about the St Augustine's Lunch Club for example she lived one street away and never knew it existed. I believe our distributing these has grown the numbers in group! Saskia Norwich City Centre

The door knocking activity was great for connecting with local people in Motum Road. These conversations highlighted the need for SEN groups and now there are two new groups supporting SEN young people and children in the community!

Exploring Experiences of Smoking

Over the summer, our Community Connectors ventured out into local 'bumping spaces', pubs and community spaces in Norwich to have conversations with residents about their experiences of smoking and quitting smoking.

This work was funded by the Norfolk Community Foundation and the Norfolk and Waveney Integrated Care Board (ICB) through the Community Voices programme.



Community Voices

The Connectors received smoking cessation training to help equip them with the knowledge required to hold community conversations with residents on this topic.

They utilised their existing networks and knowledge of their neighbourhoods to identify opportunities to have conversations with residents in a range of settings.



66 Connectors are skilled in starting conversations whilst out and about in the community. They have a great ability to put people at ease and quickly establish rapport, which enables them to capture rich insights into people's experiences of living and working in their communities.

The Connectors had over 100 conversations in their neighbourhoods with a wide range of people aged 18 and over who considered themselves occasional or regular smokers as well as those who had quit smoking.

Initially, the Connectors were unsure how having a specific focus would affect their conversations and were concerned that 'it might be intrusive' but they found that people were generally happy to chat and in many cases were very open about their life circumstances and what they felt had led them to start smoking or triggered them to return to smoking.

Norfolk Public Health are going to be making some decisions around smoking cessation services in the future, and will use the learning to ensure these services are designed to work for all communities, particularly those experiencing the greatest inequalities.

An update from The Shoebox Experiences



We introduced six fresh tours, collaborating with local partners to offer visitors unique opportunities. We were thrilled in February when Aviva opened the doors to their Norwich flagship building for us to host our 'Magnificent Marble Hall' weekly tours. Our inaugural 'Norwich Knowledge' tour began in July, highlighting the city's most notable landmarks and sharing captivating untold tales with guests.

It was open for 19 days across the summer and handled a whopping 790 enquiries from members of the public! Almost all of these were from locals and tourists looking for things to do in Norfolk or how to find places of interest.

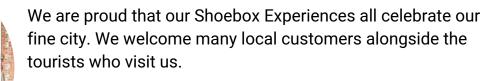
The Pop Up was staffed by members of The Shoebox Experiences team and supported by volunteer City Hosts.
